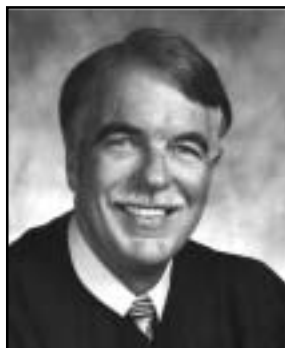

Lawyers must again recognize duties to society. Many *hired gun* lawyers now deny moral responsibility and navigate by the smell of money. They brand lawyers who thwart client fraud and crime as "rats," and those who report corrupt lawyers and judges as "snitches." The Supreme Court must provide leadership to treat this moral decay.
