Ballot Title

The Board of Directors of Clover Park School District No. 400 adopted Resolution No. 20-031 concerning a proposition to finance educational programs and operations expenses. If approved, Proposition No. 1 will authorize the District to levy the following excess taxes, replacing an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District, for educational programs and operations expenses not funded by the State:

all as provided in Resolution No. 20-031 and subject to legal limits on levy rates and amounts at the time of levy. Should Proposition No. 1 be approved?

Explanatory Statement

Passage of Proposition No. 1 would allow the Clover Park School District to replace an existing educational programs and operations levy that will expire at the end of calendar year 2020. The taxes collected by this levy will be deposited in the District's General Fund and used to pay expenses of educational programs and operations that are not fully funded by the State. These expenses include, but are not limited to, supplies, instructional materials, textbooks, technology, support staff and transportation.

The proposed four-year replacement levy would authorize the collection of taxes to provide up to \$20,467,699 in 2021, \$22,105,114 in 2022, \$23,873,524 in 2023, and \$25,783,405 in 2024. The tax levy rate required to produce these levy amounts is estimated to be \$2.50 per \$1,000 of assessed value. The exact tax levy rate and amounts to be collected may be adjusted based upon the limitations imposed by State law at the time of the levy. Taxes collected by the proposed levy, together with State levy equalization money that is contingent upon passage of the levy, will provide approximately 9% of the District's General Fund budget. Exemptions from taxes may be available, call the Pierce County Assessor at 253.798.2169.

Statement For

Statement Against

All Washington School Districts Fully Funded K-12 basic education became fully funded, to include the CPSD, under the McCleary Decision. CPSD awarded teachers significant raises (2018/2019 school year) first year teachers \$53,000/yearly (\$39.25 hourly) long term teachers \$100,000/year (\$74.07 hourly). Teachers well compensated; Proof provided via emailed weblink to disclose any teachers' pay.

This is a New Tax- State Supreme Court ruled K-12 basic education fully funded Avoid double taxation "vote no". CPSD levy is in addition to significantly increased State funding under McCleary Decision. All new taxes require a majority vote of the people; New Vote Equals New Tax!

Increased long term funding has not equaled improved education Voters approved CPSD levies over 22 years straight. Average Washington State education cost/student \$12,000/year; CPSD \$16,500/year. Washington State Office of Public Instruction reported CPSD fails to produce adequate test scores; Overall 57% of students fail to meet basic standards.

Don't be fooled; CPSD will cite other costs to pass levy CPSD will claim levy funds pay for safety, technology, extra-curricular programs. 22 years CPSD claimed more funding equaled better education; Test scores reveal otherwise.

Mr. Guerrero, CPSD that time has come; the McCleary Decision fully funded K12 education. We must stop relying on levies and the double taxation of the community. It's time we begin holding CPSD and ultimately the Board responsible by demanding a quality education as promised for years. Please Vote No.
