



## **Puyallup Watershed Grant Announcement – 2020 cycle** **Grant Applications are Due on April 7, 2020**

### **Grant Criteria & Requirements:**

Grants are available for small projects that address or improve stormwater, drainage, water quality, and habitats within the WRIA10 watershed in Pierce County. Projects may include watershed education, enhancement and restoration activities, and purchase of signage, equipment or supplies.

The maximum grant amount is \$2,500 per project, but you are encouraged to apply for less if your project does not require the full amount. A total of \$20,000 in grants may be awarded this year. Award decisions will be announced in May, and funds distributed in June.

Projects must be located within the Puyallup-White River boundaries (WRIA10). PreK-16 schools, Tribes, local agencies, nonprofit organizations, students, teacher, and businesses may apply. Thanks to administration provided by the Greater Tacoma Community Foundation and the Puyallup River Watershed Council, the grant funds will be made available upon award. Expense receipts are required.

Should a grant be awarded, you will be asked to make a 10-minute project presentation at a watershed council meeting in mid-2021, and complete a brief written final report, including accomplishments, successes and challenges.
